Silent Auction

The totals from our silent auction/golf tournament are in, and you are to be commended!

Our total income from the silent auction, the wall of wine, the golf hole and cart sponsorships, the mulligans, the putting string, the putting contest, the 300-yard drive purchases, and your miscellaneous donations came in at **\$23,522.00**. Wow!

Expenses for the golf tournament itself, prizes, sponsorship signs, sunglasses for the eclipse, food for the golfer goodie bags and the consignment items purchased came in at \$10,457.42.

That left us with a grand profit of **\$13,064.58.** Again, wow.

With that profit we paid for the siding project at a total cost of \$7,557.24. Please remember our other two bids were for \$45,000 and \$42,000. The property guys saved the church at least \$34,000+ by working all summer long and doing it themselves. I might also add that it looks fantastic. We also purchased 97 new chairs at a cost of \$4,105.04, replacing the stained and uncomfortable purple chrome chairs. The remainder of \$1,402.30 will stay in our building fund and be used for tables or toilets or something that will go wrong soon. This total will probably increase by about \$200 once eve-



ryone picks up the remainder of their silent auction items.

I cannot say it adequately enough but please accept my most sincere gratitude for all that you did to make this a success.
