Worship News

<u>Upcoming Worship – October 30th – REFORMATION/CONFIRMATION SUNDAY</u>

The Reformation began in earnest in 1517 with Martin Luther's posting his 95 theses on the University chapel door at Wittenberg. The 95 theses expressed his desire to reform the church that he loved. He wanted to enter into dialogue with others to bring his church's practices into greater agreement with his understanding of the gospel message as found in scripture.

One of the great focal points of these theses rests in Romans 3:19-28---one of the central readings on this day in the church year. *"For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus"* (Romans 3:22c-24).

It is fitting that St. Philip will have ten young people affirm their baptisms at the 10:45am service on the 30th. It is fitting that all of us are grounded in the Word of God. Through that Word, God works in us the gift of faith so that we can receive his love in Christ Jesus!

Confirmation Study Bibles

The study bibles of our 9th grade confirmation class are located in the narthex on a table. These 9th graders will be affirming their baptisms in the Rite of Confirmation at the 10:45am service on Sunday, **October 30th**. Please take time to highlight or underline a key verse that has strengthened you in your faith journey in these bibles. It may be just the verse they need to guide them in their walk of faith!

November 6th is All Saints Sunday, when we honor the memory of those who have died in the past year.

The names of all the saints will be listed in the worship bulletin; during communion you are invited to light a candle to honor the memory of your saint(s). During worship, the names of all members of St. Philip who have died in the past year will be read aloud. If you have lost someone dear to you in the past year and wish to have their name listed in the bulletin, please complete a Connection Card or call the church office. The deadline for submitting names is **Tuesday, November 1st.**

<u>Upcoming Worship – November 19th and 20th – "Pay It Forward"</u>

The Women of St. Philip are encouraging the women of our congregation to start saving their spare change so we can pool our resources to help other women both here and abroad who are less fortunate. Collection boxes are available in the narthex. Check or cash will also be accepted.

"Pay it Forward" offerings will be collected on November 19 and 20, at all three worship services. The Pay It Forward donations will be equally divided to the following three charities:

- Baby Haven-founded in 1992; supports women, mothers, and infants. They offer intensive addiction treatment with a 90% success rate.
- Delores Project-formed in 2000; provides shelter and services for homeless women.
- Women's Development Association-founded in 1997; its mission is to encourage, train, and support women and children in literacy, health education, and economic empowerment.

Scripture Readings for October 29-30, 2016

FIRST READING: Jeremiah 31:31-34

The renewed covenant will not be breakable, but like the old covenant it will expect the people to live upright lives. To know the Lord means that one will defend the cause of the poor and needy (Jer. 22:16). The renewed covenant is possible only because the Lord will forgive iniquity and not remember sin. Our hope lies in a God who forgets

³¹The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. ³²It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD. ³³But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. ³⁴No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the LORD," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

SECOND READING: Romans 3:19-28

Paul's words stand at the heart of the preaching of Martin Luther and the other Reformation leaders. No human beings make themselves right with God through works of the law. We are brought into a right relationship with God through the divine activity centered in Christ's death. This act is a gift of grace that liberates us from sin and empowers our faith in Jesus Christ.

¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

²¹But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in

his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.

GOSPEL: John 8:31-36

Jesus speaks of truth and freedom as spiritual realities known through his word. He reveals the truth that sets people free from sin.

³¹Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; ³²and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." ³³They answered him, "We are descendants of Abraham and have never been slaves to anyone. What do you mean by saying, 'You will be made free'?" ³⁴Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. ³⁵The slave does not have a permanent place in the household; the son has a place there forever. ³⁶"So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed."

Proposed Columbarium Project Report

The columbarium team had their first meeting earlier this week. Team members in attendance were Larry Kemp (engineer), Charlie Petersen (architect/design), Cindy Breidenbach (design), two members from Eidos Architect and Linda Goodnough (business administrator). Team members absent were John Schutt (project manager) and Chuck Rogge (lighting engineer). It is intended that the columbarium will be placed in the back yard outside of the sanctuary on the west side, on the upper section close to the retaining wall but built into the natural berm of the hill. We had discussions regarding the size of the columbarium and different design ideas. Our next step is to contact Jefferson County to see what requirements need to be met. The columbarium team will keep the congregation informed as the team conducts its research, and members are welcome to give feedback about the proposed project. Shera Eddy and LeRae Schnickel attended Advocacy Team Training at the RMS office Saturday, October 8. John Johnson, ELCA Director of Domestic Policy in Washington D.C. was a guest presenter along with two Advocacy Teams from Atonement Lutheran in Lakewood and Holy Trinity Lutheran in Littleton.

The ELCA advocacy is based on the following four Biblical values: care for creation, concern for people living in poverty, struggling with hunger and disease, peace making, and hospitality to strangers. As the ELCA, we believe God is calling us into the world to serve together. ELCA advocacy is a wide-ranging effort, touching on some very local concerns to complex international issues like migration.

We enjoyed learning how our sister churches, Atonement and Holy Trinity, are lifting up social issues to their members and raising their level of concern for our neighbors near and far.
