End of Year Giving Opportunities

If you would like to make a special year-end gift to St. Philip Lutheran Church, here are two options that can improve your tax situation as well as benefit the ministry of our congregation.

Donate Stocks or Mutual Funds

Contributing securities to St. Philip Lutheran Church offers valuable financial and tax benefits:

- Donors may deduct the entire value of the securities as a charitable donation
- Donors avoid paying capital gains tax on any increased value of the securities.

Charitable IRA Rollover

Many donors have discovered the benefits of making a gift using their Individual Retirement Account (IRA). If you are 70½ or older, you may be interested in this way to make a significant gift while lowering the income and taxes from your IRA withdrawals. Benefits of an IRA charitable rollover:

- Donors avoid taxes on transfers of up to \$100,000 from your IRA to St. Philip
- Donors satisfy their required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year
- The gift reduces the donor's taxable income, even if they do not itemize deductions
- A charitable IRA rollover is not subject to the 50% deduction limits on charitable gifts
- You make a real difference in the ministries of St. Philip!

Chrismons

This will be our final installment of our series on Chrismons. I hope you have enjoyed learning a little bit about this Lutheran Christmas tradition.

Jerusalem Cross: The Jerusalem cross is a heraldic cross and Christian cross variant consisting of a large cross potent surrounded by four smaller Greek crosses, one in each quadrant. A cross potent, also known as a crutch cross, is a form of heraldic cross with crossbars or "crutches" at the four ends. The large cross in the center stands for Christ, while the four smaller crosses represent the four Gospels and the spread of the Word to all four corners of the earth. Another suggestion is that the five crosses represent the five wounds of Christ on the cross.

Three Circles: The three circles, also known as the Borromean Rings, represent the Holy Trinity. The word trinity comes from the Latin noun trinitas mean-



ing "three are one." The trinity represents the belief that God is one Being made up of three distinct Persons who exist in co-equal, co-eternal communion as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Crown: The crown represents the fact that Jesus is our King of Kings and Lord of Lords. He wore a crown of thorns, but we represent his place as Lord of all with a crown fit for a king. A King's Crown is the symbol of royal power and authority. It symbolizes Jesus as King of the Jews, in fulfillment of prophetic expectation, as well as the exalted Christ as King of Kings.
