# **Worship News**

## Thank You, Paula

What were you doing 30 years ago? On Palm Sunday, 1986, Paula Googins began her service as the lead nursery attendant at St. Philip Lutheran Church. For 30 years, "Ms. Paula," (as she is known by the children) has faithfully provided love and care for the children of this congregation. Many of these children (now adults) go back to greet Ms. Paula in the nursery when they return to worship at St. Philip.

On this coming Sunday, Palm/Passion Sunday, we are planning to recognize Ms. Paula at our Sunday morning worship services. We will also have a special cake at the coffee fellowship between services. Please plan on attending so you can say "thank you" to Paula for her 30 years of service! Thankfully, Paula plans on continuing her work among us!

## **Upcoming Worship - Holy Week**

Holy Week begins with the Sunday of the Passion (also known as Palm Sunday) on March 20<sup>th</sup>. We hope you will join us as we celebrate the triumphant entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem, then through the reading of the story of Jesus' passion we are invited into the agony of our Lord.

The services of **Maundy Thursday**, **Good Friday**, and the **Vigil of Easter** unfold in a single movement, as the church each year makes the passage with Christ through death into life.

We start with **Maundy Thursday** on **March 24**<sup>th</sup>, where Jesus celebrates the Passover meal and institutes Holy Communion. Our 5<sup>th</sup> graders will be celebrating their first communion that evening, and the rite of washing feet will be observed. (Please note: the Maundy Thursday worship service begins at 7:30pm.) On **Good Friday, March 25**<sup>th</sup>, the second day of the Three Days, we hear the story of the crucifixion of Jesus and contemplate the meaning of his death on the cross. From that moment, we then begin to celebrate Easter at the **Easter Vigil on Saturday, March 26**<sup>th</sup>, the third day of the Three Days. Saturday is the day Christ passes over from death to life, or from darkness to light. It is also the day we experience the story of salvation as we hear stories of faith, sing songs of praise, baptize new children of God, share the bread and wine, and join together with Christ.

And beginning with the 6:30am sunrise service on Sunday, **March 27**<sup>th</sup>, we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord! There are a total of four worship services on Easter Sunday; 6:30am, 8am, 9:30am, and 11am. Come, now is the time worship!

Please plan on attending the Vigil of Easter worship service on **Saturday, March 26**, as we celebrate the baptism of Tristan Alan Lofblad! The service begins at 5:30pm. Tristan is the son of Madeline and Alan Lofblad.

## Mid-Week Lenten Worship

Our theme for our mid-week Lenten services this year is Prayer Questions. Each Wednesday night at 7:00pm we will gather in the sanctuary for a time of prayer and worship focusing on different aspects of God's great gift of prayer. These worship services will be preceded by a Bread and Broth fellowship time in the fellowship hall which will begin at 6 pm. Here is the schedule for our worship services:

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>11</sup>and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
