### Strategic Planning Committee

The SPLC Church Council has commissioned a group of congregation members to start a strategic planning process for our church. The last time a strategic planning effort was undertaken by SPLC was back in 2007. That was the same year a guy named Steve Jobs introduced the world to the iPhone. Needless to say a lot has happened since 2007 and SPLC is prudent in revisiting our strategic plan.

Many may ask the purpose of a strategic plan, additionally many don't remember the one in 2007, why should we revisit it? Strategic plans, when conducted with the input of the people they cover serve the purpose of helping an organization do a better job in many ways. They improve the functioning of an organization by focusing the energy, resources, and time of everyone in the organization in the same direction.

The Strategic Planning Team is taking a very disciplined approach to creating this strategic plan update and will seek input from the entire congregation at points in the process. It is the desire of the team that the output of this effort will be a clear, concise plan that will help to focus our efforts and our resources on the most important things we hold dear. This focus will allow us to make clear decisions on projects, plans and efforts from the church council to the lay person in the congregation. We all will know the mission, vision, and values based on this updated plan, making decisions clear and quick.
