Dumpster Changes

If you have had any kind of meeting or event at St. Philip lately that generated trash and/or recycling, you may have noticed a change to the dumpsters behind the building. They are now locked. We had issues with people outside of the church dumping into the dumpsters and filling them past capacity. Waste Management fines us if the dumpsters are not closed all the way when they come to pick up the trash. If there are bags sitting in front of the dumpsters they won't do the pick up at all!

The key to both the recycling and trash dumpsters is kept in the office. You can come by any time and we will show you where and how to unlock them. Please do not fill the dumpsters beyond capacity—the lid must close. If it is full you may put the bags behind the dumpsters out of sight of the parking lot. No plastic trash bags are allowed in the recycling dumpster, so please dump all recycling in the dumpster loose.

FYI the bins are unlocked Monday-Friday from 11am-2pm for the preschool. Church groups are free to put trash and recycling from events in during that time.
