Come Make a Difference in the Life of one of our Confirmation Students

Are you interested in making a difference and having an active role in the faith of one of our confirmation students? St. Philip is continuing its mentoring program for our confirmation students! Our mentors have made and continue to make a big impact on our confirmation students and their faith. One of our confirmation students wrote, "One very special person who influenced my faith was ... my 7th and 8th grade mentor during confirmation. She helped me to strengthen my faith and come out of my comfort zone with prayer. She taught me a very valuable lesson about the Bible and how to connect it to prayer. I am very thankful to have had her as a mentor during this confirmation experience."

Our goal is to pair up one confirmation student with one adult in the congregation. The mentors come to mentor during the seasons of Advent and Lent. We would like the mentors to walk with the confirmation student for two years as they go through confirmation. The hope is that this relationship continues as they are in high school.

There are three Wednesdays in Advent where the mentors will meet with their mentee (December 5th, 12th, and 19th). Then we will come back in Lent to meet again (March 13th and 20th, April 3rd and 10th). We will begin with worship at 6pm and then join in a meal together after worship. After the meal, the mentors and the confirmation students will meet for mentoring for 30-45 minutes, until 8pm.

The responsibility of the mentors will be to get to know the confirmation student you are paired up with, talk to them, pray with them, pray for them, share your faith with them, encourage them, and support them in their life and faith. This will be done through natural conversation, a guided discussion on a certain topic, and connecting with them outside of mentoring.

Stewardship and Gratitude

I will give thanks to you, Lord, with all my heart; I will tell of all your wonderful deeds. – **Psalm 9:1**

Gratitude is the attitude, the key that can unlock the doors of our lives to more joy, satisfaction, contentment, love, and peace. Gratitude undergirds everything we do as disciples of Christ and stewards of the gifts with which God entrusts us. Are these bold claims? Yes! Are they true? Without a doubt!

Blame it on our consumer culture that constantly implores us to buy more, or simply blame it on human nature, but many of us focus way too much on our unfilled desires, our unmet wants. Whether it's a fancier car, a bigger house, whiter teeth, more friends, a fatter paycheck, or skinnier body, our wants can overwhelm and define us if we're not careful. Want and desire can blind us to the blessings we already have in this wonderful life that God has given us.

What's the cure? Gratitude! It's an attitude that can be developed through prayer and practice. And since we are gearing up for Thanksgiving on November 22, why not make it a month-long effort?

Start by making a list of things for which you are thankful today. (If you have a smartphone that enables you to take notes, use it. A small pad or index card will also do.) Include *at least* 20 items on the list.

Carry the list with you and pray over it several times a day, saying, "I thank God for *this*. I thank God for *that*," and so on. Make it a working project, adding to the list as you think of new blessings or reordering them in priority.

As the weeks unfold, see if you won't develop an attitude of gratitude for the things you already have and a deep satisfaction and peace for your life. Gratitude unlocks our lives to the abundance that God intends for us.


