Honor and Shame Study

Every culture and society in this world has an "operating system", much like our computers. And for many cultures – especially in the Mideast and the Far East – the main operating system – that is, how they interface with one another – comes from an honor/shame context.

In cultural anthropology, there are three distinct cultures:

- Guilt/Innocence
- Honor/Shame
- Fear/Retribution

What makes the three different is how behavior is governed with respect to government laws, business rules, or social etiquette. This type of classification has been applied to the emotions they use to control individuals (especially children) and maintaining social order, swaying them into obedience and conformity.

In a guilt/innocence society, control is maintained by creating and continually reinforcing the feeling of guilt (and the expectation of punishment now or in the afterlife) for certain condemned behaviors. In an honor/shame society, the means of control is the inculcation of shame and the complementary threat of ostracism. In a fear society, control is kept by the fear of retribution.

One can divide most of the cultures of the world through these three lens. And since the Bible was written in the Mideast – in an honor/shame society – we need to understand this context if we are to read the Bible accurately. In fact, some of the passages that may have seemed odd or even difficult before may have new light cast upon them through our study.

Please join Pastor Randy as he shares his insights on honor/shame, using some resources that he has received in his Mideast travel and studies. **We will meet Sundays in MC-4/5 from 9:15 – 10:15am.** Handouts will be provided.

- 1 yard of white solid fabric for background and inner border
- 4 fat quarters (18"x21") of assorted pink prints for X blocks
- 4 fat quarters of assorted agua prints for O blocks
- 1/2 yard of gray print for outer border
- 1/2 yard of any complimentary fabric for binding
- 2 3/4 yards of fabric for backing
- 47"x47" piece of batting (We have a good amount of batting in our storage closet. Check it out before buying some.)

We plan to supply the batting for all projects until our money runs out.

You don't need to choose the colors suggested above. Choose what colors you like. Pattern and directions are in LeRae Schickel's mailbox along with some other patterns. Help yourself!
