Snow Shoveling Teams

We are setting up Snow Shoveling Teams for the next six (6) months --- those months we expect we could have snow events. Each team is responsible for shoveling the SIDEWALKS ONLY for a seven (7) day period --- from midnight Friday to the next Friday midnight (Saturday to Saturday). If shoveling is required on a Sunday, the start time is 7am --- the other days it is about 8am. Each team is typically three (3) people.

The available pieces of equipment are: snow blower, snow plow (on a riding mower), and snow shovels. It usually takes about 1½ hours to clear all the walks.
