Glasses. Contacts. Laser eye surgery. We go to a lot of trouble in order to see things clearly. We do this because one of our primary senses – likely the primary sense – is being able to see.

In fact, many use the saying, "Seeing is believing". We count on our ability to see things to determine what is real and important, and what is not. Seeing is empowering: now I can just look at my cell phone to unlock it.

During Lent 2020, we are going to focus on how and where we see God. So often, we see God only in some of the stories of the Bible, but not so much in real life and elsewhere. But God is often doing new things right before us, in ways and places we may have overlooked. And that is a good thing, because we may need a new perspective as we seek to live out our calling to be God's holy people.

St. Philip Prayer Chain Update

We are extremely grateful for you all and your prayers. We know prayer works and those who have been on the prayer chain have been so grateful for you to pray for them in their time of need, in their thanksgivings, and in their concerns. This prayer chain started on the phone by people calling others. It then moved to email and now we are adding it to a prayer app. Tom will continue to send the emails, but we thought we would try out a prayer app. All prayer requests will be added to St. Philip's Feed on the Echo Prayer App.

How to get the app: Go to the App Store or Google Play Store and search for "Echo Prayer". Download the free app and create an account. You will then want to find the St. Philip feed. Go to the menu and tap on "Feeds". Search for "St. Philip Lutheran Church" by clicking on "Find a New Feed". We are the only St. Philip and the image is of our logo. Click the follow button and you will now be following our prayer chain.

With the number of people who are on this prayer chain, the app does not allow anyone to add a prayer request, so you will still have to send in your prayer request to Tom Silco and/or Angela Seep, church secretary. Every time a new prayer is added, you will be notified. You will receive multiple notifications on Mondays when the prayers are added from the weekend, so if the notifications are too much for you, you can turn off notifications, but you will have to go into the app to see when new prayer requests are added.

Only the administrators know who is following the feed. Since the feed is a list of people and their prayer requests, we will keep people on the prayer chain for two weeks; therefore if you would like them on longer, please let us know or submit another prayer request with an update.

I am also including some updates and success stories from families we've served in the past few months. Thank you for the role that you have played in these families' journeys out of homelessness!

St Philip Success Stories:

- Rachel, Patrick, and their daughter, Elizabeth, have moved into an apartment. They were very happy to be reunited with their cat, Gus Gus, who we boarded in our Pets with a Promise program. The family keeps in touch through our Home program, which supports families with long term case management after they leave shelter.
- Tamaera and her kids are enjoying their new apartment and keeping in touch via the Home program.
- Kendra and her son, Thy, are now enrolled in the Family Promise TBRA program, which supports families with rental assistance in Arapahoe County. Thy is working toward obtaining his GED.
- Whitney and her daughters have also moved into their new apartment.
- Sheena and her three kids were more than ready to move out of shelter by the time their Section 8 unit was ready for move-in. She has been focused on settling in and getting her children used to new routines.

• Joaquin, Aracelis, Yani, and Edward have settled into their new apartment, and keeping in touch via our Home Aftercare program. Joaquin continues to work at the job he obtained through our partnership with The Reciprocity Collective, a nonprofit that provides employment support.
