### This Day in History: Passover

The Passover is the most important holy day for the Jewish people. This day recalls God's deliverance of His Chosen people from the hands of the Egyptians over 1,000 years ago. Trusting His word, the people spread the blood of a lamb over the lentils of their doorways, signifying to the Angel of Death to leave the

occupants safe within that house. Soon thereafter, the Pharaoh allows the Jewish slave to leave Egypt with Moses as their leader. The Passover reminds all Jews of their past, and of how God brought them out of slavery into the freedom of the Promised Land.

### Crucifixions Scheduled

Three men are scheduled for crucifixion at Golgotha Hill tomorrow. The Romans, once again trying to prove their power over we Jews, will kill three partisans. One of these three, named Barabbas, had reportedly killed a Roman guard. According to the

authorities, the three will be nailed up around noon, just in time for them to die before the beginning of the Sabbath at nightfall. The families have asked, in lieu of flowers, that memorial money be given to the Zealots for a Free Israel Fund.
