Outdoor In-Person Worship

Outdoor worship continues this weekend, August 1 & 2! Both the Saturday evening worship service at 5:30pm and the Sunday morning worship service at 9:00am will be held in person and online!

As the cases of COVID-19 begin to rise again in Colorado, we ask that you carefully weigh the amount of risk you are willing to take.

- If you do not want to take any risk, we encourage you to continue worshiping online, which will be live and posted after the inperson service.
- If you are willing to take a minimal amount of risk and want to be in person, come worship in the parking lot where you will be able to turn on your radio, listen and participate in the worship service in your car or just outside your car where you will see the service from a distance.
- If you are willing to take a higher level of risk and want to worship in the courtyard (as we do for Rally Day/Gather Together Sunday), you may bring your own lawn chair and sit in the courtyard socially distanced by families.

All people worshiping outside of their car are asked to wear a mask at all times.

Holy Communion will be part of these worship services. We have individually packaged communion wafers and grape juice cups, which will be distributed as you arrive and consumed during the Holy Communion portion of the service. If you need gluten-free wafers, we invite you to bring gluten-free crackers or bread.
