Important Worship Updates

Saturday Night Worship Service Going on Hiatus

After two months of in-person worship on Saturday evenings, it has been decided to put the Saturday evening service on a hiatus. When we began outdoor in-person worship in the middle of July, we weren't sure how many people would come. The Saturday evening service has been small for many years, and COVID-19 has certainly impacted the worship attendance at our outdoor service. We have an average of ten people in the courtyard for Saturday worship and three on Zoom. Therefore, we have decided to put the Saturday evening service on hiatus until further notice.

Adding a Second Service on Sunday Mornings

Starting on Sunday, September 13 (Rally Day), we are adding a second Sunday morning worship service, which will begin at 10:30am. The Sunday morning services at 9:00am have been going well, with an average of 55 people in the courtyard and over 20 families/individuals on Zoom. We have been worshiping outside in the courtyard, which has been pleasant. It is our priority to hold worship outside for as long as we can. If we are not able to worship outside due to weather, we will move inside to the sanctuary. Worship in the sanctuary will be dependent upon the number of COVID-19 cases in our area. If cases are too high or state regulations prohibit us from worshiping in the sanctuary and we cannot worship outside, worship will be livestreamed only. There will be no Saturday service on September 5 and only one service at 9am on September 6.

Sunday School

The Children's Ministry Team has decided to hold Sunday School in person and will **begin on Sunday October 4**. With in-person school starting after Labor Day for Jefferson County, we want to evaluate the COVID-19 levels as a result of in-person school before we expose our children to another group; therefore, limiting the spread of COVID-19. Sunday School will be held outside as long as we are able; if we are unable to be outside, we will have Sunday school inside in the Fellowship Hall or Sanctuary. The location of Sunday school will follow the location of worship; if worship is inside, Sunday school will more than likely be inside.

<u>Pastor Randy's Bible Study</u> Beginning Sunday, September 13 at 11:30am In-person (sanctuary) and on Zoom

Topic: Books that did not make it into the Bible

We will start by looking at some of the books that were left out of the New Testament Canon. Specifically, we will look at the Didache, and what issues the early Christians were facing as Christianity became distinct from Judaism. We will also spend some time discussing the Shepherd of Hermas, First Clement and the Gospel of Thomas. Our goal for the first few weeks will be to understand the context in which the books for the New Testament were written, and what issues they (and other writings) were addressing.
