Volunteers and Supplies Needed for Expanded Family Promise Shelter

Family Promise has been given the incredible opportunity to lease an 11-bedroom home in the Capitol Hill neighborhood in order to expand their shelter capacity during a

time when so many more families are facing economic hardship. Starting on September 21, Family Promise will begin serving an additional 2-4 families (up to 16 individuals) in their newly leased space. They will also still continue sheltering the usual 8 families in the hotel until at least the end of the year. While the new space is fully furnished, it needs to be stocked with household items, toiletries, cleaning supplies, and food. There are also daily volunteer slots available for folks who are willing to prepare a meal and deliver it to the home at 6:00pm, as well as a weekly slot for grocery shopping/delivery. While there are no in-person volunteer slots available just yet, opportunities for folks to volunteer in the evenings and overnight start in October.
