The way we do church and be the church has changed drastically during this pandemic of COVID-19. Ministry has not stopped, it has just been different. There were ministries that continued to meet and moved to a virtual format. There were also new ministries that started during this time - to care for our community and to gather our community. were a prayer group, which continues to meet, and the zip code ministry. Pastor Brad also hosted Sunday Night Game Nights where many people joined to play Bingo on Zoom! Get Excited: Looking Forward to Great Things

There are many uncertainties about the year 2021, but there is one thing we are certain of: God will continue to work through St. Philip Lutheran Church! God will lead and guide us in working towards our mission of intentionally building relationships through Christ to grow and serve.

St. Philip Lutheran Church is a congregation that is being called to **Gather, Serve and Celebrate**! We gather to build and grow our relationship with God, those we know and those we don't know. When we **gather** together, we care for one another, support one another, learn together, learn from one another and build community. When we **serve**, we look at the needs of others: members of St. Philip, visitors, our neighbors around us, near and far, the world, and God's creation. We come together to **celebrate**, worshiping God to give thanks and praise to God. Celebrations are often filled with much joy, music, food and fellowship.

One of the first steps we will be taking to work towards our mission is filling our staff. There are three staff positions we will be filling for the sake of our mission: A full time Deacon, a full time Coordinator of Children, Youth and Family Ministry and a parttime Coordinator of Technology. What is a deacon? A deacon is an ordained position in the church and is a Minister of **Word and Service**. A pastor is an ordained position in the church and is a Minister of **Word and Sacrament**. The deacon will focus on the area of Serve, while also working with other ministry areas.

Gather, Serve and Celebrate

Our new mission leads us to a new ministry structure: Gather, Serve and Celebrate. We are excited to be starting small group ministry to implement this structure, where our goal is for seventy percent of our congregation to be in a small group.
