Worship Moving Into the Sanctuary Starting This Sunday!

Due to snow in the forecast, we are moving worship services indoors starting

this Sunday, October 25. Both services will be held in the Sanctuary. We are able to have 20 family units. Each service will have a section of pews to sit in, which allows two pews in between each family unit. The pews are color coded and we will have each service sit in a different colored pew. We will also be sanitizing after each service.

We ask that you register your family for worship. This way we do not go over our occupancy to ensure we are able to safely distance ourselves throughout the sanctuary. Anyone who does not sign up for worship will be able to worship in the narthex if the sanctuary is full. We will have the ushers check people in and take everyone's temperature. Communion and offering will be done the same way we have been doing it outside.

Another change that has already started is that the congregation is able to speak the responses, the creed, the Lord's Prayer, etc. At this time, we continue to ask the congregation not to sing.

We will continue to livestream the 9:00am service and post the recording on our website.
