St. Philip Early Learning Center

We held our annual Children's Consignment Sale the week of April 18-24.

We had 114 sellers who sold over 8,764 items for a total of \$27,591.

Our sellers made over \$17,000.

We had almost 1,000 items donated to sell which brought in \$1,386.

Over 120 people volunteered their time to work the sale.

Buyers were down this week and we only had 300 shoppers compared to 400-500 in previous years.

St Philip Preschool collected \$10,388.

After expenses we ended up with a profit around \$8,000.

Diaper Drive


