Notes from the Organist

For the fourth and final installment of the Felix Mendelssohn prelude/postlude series, our organist Bryan Chuan will present the Prelude and Fugue in E minor, Opus 37 and the Third Organ Sonata in A major, two grand and original works incorporating the Lutheran liturgical tradition. The Prelude and Fugue in E minor is the first of 6 Preludes and Fugues composed between 1835-1837, and the Organ Sonata in A major is a compilation of three disparate works -- a wedding march, double fugue, and adagio religioso -- that Mendelssohn realized conveyed a convincing narrative when put together.

Both works contain a lengthy "crescendo fugue," a fugue that begins with a quiet statement of the subject (the main theme of the fugue) and grows in speed and intensity until the conclusion. The Fugue in E minor surprisingly ends with a freely-composed chorale in E major reminiscent of "A Mighty Fortress" and the "Old Hundredth." The Organ Sonata begins with a wedding march originally composed for Mendelssohn's sister Fanny, which suddenly transitions into a bleak double fugue underpinned by the Lenten chorale *Aus tiefer Not schrei zu dir* (Out of the depths I cry to Thee). Unlike the standard sonata form which concludes with a fast-paced movement, the sonata concludes with a quiet meditation reflecting on the turmoil of the previous music.
