"For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."



SERVING Others, Serving God

Over the past year and a half, COVID-19 has impacted the <u>SERVE</u> ministries of St. Philip Lutheran Church. Our Sharing with Sheridan Food Pantry went from serving an average of 32 families a week to serving over 100 families a week. St. Philip went from serving homeless families in our church, through Family Promise, to supporting Family Promise financially. The Sr. High youth, in 2021, went on a mission trip to Oklahoma City to do service projects for organizations that serve those who are hungry, in need of medical care and care for children and youth after school. The impact on our SERVE ministries has meant that there was a larger need of care in our community and in our world. We are grateful that we were able to respond to that need as God worked through us to care for those in need.

In 2022, our SERVE ministries will continue to work hard as we will be building on these ministries and growing our service to those in need. This next year, St. Philip will begin to host Love INC's diaper ministry, Safe Haven. Through this ministry, we will be meeting with, praying with and providing diapers to families in need. This ministry is not just about providing diapers for families, but also about building relationships with the families to truly care for them and support them to the best of our ability. This next summer, our Sr. High youth will be going to Minneapolis, MN for the ELCA Youth Gathering where they will learn, grow and serve! St. Philip will once again be hosting homeless families in our church, through Family Promise. In addition, our Sharing with Sheridan Food Pantry will continue to provide food for families in need in Sheridan. God has certainly blessed this ministry with many grants and many amazing volunteers. We are grateful to be able to continue to make such a big impact in Sheridan.

The Impact of Serving

As Martin Luther said, our faith leads us to serve. It is out of our faith and our relationship with God that we turn towards those in need to care for them and help them in their need. Serving those in need, volunteering and doing service projects impacts the lives of so many. There is a feeling of fulfillment, purpose

and impact. When you serve, you make a difference in the world and you make a difference in someone's life. The ELCA has used the phrase, "God's Work. Our Hands." When we serve, we truly are doing God's work with our hands; God is working through us. This is why it is so important for us to volunteer, and this is why our youth come back from mission trips feeling inspired, accomplished, and spiritually filled.
