Worship News

Midweek Advent Worship and Potluck

Advent is a time of waiting and preparation. Join us on Wednesdays at 11:30am in the Sanctuary on December 1, 8 and 15. These worship services will be a time of reflection, prayer and song as we reflect on Christmas and its meaning. The first week of Advent we will be moving towards the center as we reflect on our lives, the things we carry and on letting go. The second week, December 8, we will spend time in the center, a still, calm and quiet place where we are able to be in the presence of God. The third week, December 15, we will move back to the outside, reflecting on the blessings of God and the hope we have in Jesus. We hope you will join us for these spiritual services as we reflect and experience God.

Following each service, we will move to the Ministry Center for a potluck lunch. Bring a dish to share and join in the fellowship as we eat together.

Celebrating Christmas Through the Centuries on the Organ

Our organist Bryan Chuan has chosen an array of music celebrating Christmas that highlights the versatility and evolution of the organ through the centuries.

December 12: Noels by Louis Daguin (1694-1772)

Louis Daquin wrote numerous works for organ and harpsichord that highlight the technological innovations of the instruments in pre-Revolution France. Daquin is most famous for his set of 12 Noels, each of which feature rapid alternation and manipulation of organ stops to highlight different timbres on the instrument. December 19: Sacred music by Leo Sowerby (1895-1968)

Leo Sowerby is considered the "dean of American church music," having composed a vast array of organ solos and choir anthems in a modern yet accessible style. Here is a recording of Sowerby's most difficult organ work, known for its dazzling pedalwork: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=4NKjyPvR3t4.

Christmas Eve: Music for the young and giving thanks

The 1 and 3 pm services will feature music for the youth and young at heart. Norberto Guinaldo is currently the organist at Garden Grove United Methodist Church in California, and he wrote settings of Spanish villancicos (carols) for organ. The 5 and 7 pm services will feature music by the two titans of early 20th century German organ music, Siegfried Karg-Elert (1877-1933) and Max Reger (1873-1916). These composers are known for their extremely complex writing, but they were also capable of writing shorter and lighter works suitable for services. Adestes Fideles from Cathedral Windows by Karg-Elert ingeniously hides the tune of "O Come All Ye Faithful" amid shepherds pipes, and Dankpsalm by Max Reger sets two hymns that recognize the omnipotence of God.

Memory Tree

On **Sunday, December 19** we will have our Memory Tree service following the 9am worship service. Meet in the lobby by the church office. You may bring an ornament in memory of a loved one who has passed away; we also have ornaments available to use.

Christmas Eve Worship Schedule

This year on **Christmas Eve** we will have four worship services here at St. Philip. Services at **1pm and 3pm** will be more family-oriented and involve the children in attendance. Services at **5pm and 7pm** will be more traditional, with choir, bells, and instrumentalists providing the music. We will livestream the 3pm and 5pm services. A Zoom link will be posted closer to Christmas Eve. Come worship with us as we celebrate our Savior's birth!

Last week we served 130 families. We appreciate your support!




