WANTED: PART-TIME SUMMER CUSTODIAN(S)

Beginning mid-May, St. Philip is looking for a responsible adult who would like to have a flexible part-time job taking care of the building. This could be one individual or two working together as a team.

Job description:

- Regular vacuuming, restroom cleaning and emptying of trash and recycling; other less frequent tasks TBD (Entry doors, dusting etc.)
- Work could be accomplished in daytime or evening hours, some on weekends if desired
- Paid once a month, on an hourly basis (Rate DOE)
- May through mid-August, i.e. while Early Learning Center classes are on break: Schedule to be determined, ideally 3 days/week, totaling about 9-11 hours/week; more hours around special events, e.g. Vacation Bible School (July 11-15)
