Hear how an endowment grant given in 2020 of \$1,000 changed a man's life and how he is using his vision to help others. His body was thrown into a river and he remained unconscious for four years. Five years later he has written three books on surviving traumatic brain injury (TBI) and other "Unwelcomed Companions". Wednesday Morning Women's Bible Study meets every 2nd and 4th Wednesday of the month at 9:30am at church.


