Serve Focus for May-St. Philip Community Garden

As we enter the 8th year of the donation garden, I have some updates and requests. The last several years the garden has donated over 800 pounds of fresh produce to the Sheridan Food Bank each summer; and we plan to produce with a successful harvest in 2023. Please contact Ana Tolentino at atolenti@aol.com or 303-949-6088 if you are interested in a plot or contributing to the following list.

- One or two 10 X 10 plots are available for personal gardens. The fee is \$40 each (includes water) and 5 hours of service in the donation garden is required during the season.
- I injured my foot and need help prepping the plots; namely digging, spreading compost and carrying heavy items. An hour or two from several people would be very helpful. I am flexible so we can work with your schedule.
- Cleaned eggshells for planting with tomatoes.
- Carrot seeds.
- Bags of organic compost (12-15)
- Jalapeno seedlings (8-12) when they become available.
- Watering volunteers to contribute an hour a week to water the garden.
- Please **do not** save vented clamshells for the tomatoes. I do not have a place to store them. I will need them starting in July, and at that point I will ask them to be clean and brought to the kitchen.
- We will plan to have children plant the pumpkin patch in early June. Details TBA.
