#### Adult Faith Formation Discussion on the ELCA Social Statements

Deacon Korra and Pastor Brad will be leading a discussion on the ELCA Social Statements for the adult faith formation hour on Sunday mornings from 10:15-11:15am. There will be a couple of guest speakers coming to speak on the topics and share their perspectives. We will begin with an introduction on the ELCA and politics on **Sunday**, **September 17 at 10:30am in MC-4/5**. Pastor Bonita Bock will be joining us to share her involvement with Lutheran advocacy and why the ELCA is involved in advocacy. See Pastor Bonita's bio below.

In preparation for these conversations, we invite you read the social statements ahead of time. All of the social statements are posted on the ELCA website (http://www.elca.org/Faith/Faith-and-Society/Social-Statements). The first social statement that will help you prepare for our conversation on September 17 is the Church in Society social statement.

As we come together, we will learn, listen and discuss. This time is not set up to be a debate. Please bring an open mind and be willing to listen to people who have a different perspective or understanding than you. As a reminder, we come together in unity in our faith in Christ, but we are not all unified in our beliefs; especially on topics regarding politics. We hope you will join us in these conversations to learn more about the ELCA.

Pastor Bonita Bock is a retired Pastor and has served on the advocacy ministry board with Peter Seversen of the Rocky Mountain Synod for about five years in a volunteer position. She has had several other volunteer responsibilities that deal with legislative advocacy. She is retired from the religion faculty of Wartburg College. During that tenure, she taught a course on religion and politics. Bonita has also served on the adjunct faculty at Iliff Seminary for many years and has been on the Urban Servant Corps Board.
