Sharing with Sheridan Food Pantry

Thank you for all the donations to our food pantry, *Sharing with Sheridan,* in November which helped our neighbors in the Sheridan area. For the month, we averaged 193 families/643 persons per week, the highest average on record. This is an increase of 9% in just one month and nearly double the population we served two years ago. We are blessed to have the food, volunteer, and financial resources to meet the increased demand; there has not yet been a week when we have been unable to serve everyone.

Last Tuesday our awesome team of volunteers served another record-setting crowd of **229 families**. For the coming week we can use:

- Clean plastic grocery bags
- Pasta sauce
- Jelly/jam

We continue to be overstocked with egg cartons and have no additional storage.

For those who wish to drop off donations directly at the food pantry, please take them to the east door of the Sheridan Recreation Center on Thursdays only between 11:30am and 1:00pm. You can also bring items to church anytime.

Sharing with Sheridan Diaper Collection

We are now collecting diapers sizes 4, 5 and 6 for our food pantry. They can be dropped off in the narthex or the SwS storage bins next to the office. Other ways to participate with our food pantry include transferring computer files or helping with occasional pick up of food on Thursdays.
