#### **Epiphany**

This Sunday is Epiphany Sunday and begins the season of Epiphany. Epiphany is the celebration of God's glory revealed in the person of Jesus Christ. Like the light of the star that guided the magi to Jesus, the light of Christ reveals who we are: children of God who are claimed and washed in the waters of baptism. We are sent out to be beacons of the light of Christ, sharing the good news of God's love to all people.
