AUGUSTANA HOMES UPDATE - CONSTRUCTION IS UNDERWAY!

St. Philip is helping to support the building of 8 Habitat homes adjacent to Augustana Lutheran Church in the Washington Virginia Vale neighborhood of Denver (near Alameda & Leetsdale.) Construction has begun on the infrastructure for the stormwater, water and sewer lines for the 4 duplexes - we'll keep you posted as the work progresses!

Update on the Venezuelan Family in Denver

As of January 8, 2024, 37,018 migrants from the southern border have arrived in Denver (many from Venezuela) and 4,581 people are currently being sheltered by the city. Thank you for the support offered so far for the Villarroel-Brito family, from individuals and congregations in the Rocky Mountain Synod!

This family arrived in Denver in October, 2023, and after several weeks in a hotel shelter they moved into an apartment just before Christmas. The children are enrolled in school. A 19-year-old son crossed the border on Christmas Eve and arrived safely in Denver just before January 1st. As the family settles into their new home, they are focused on applying for asylum in the United States and meeting basic needs. They will need ongoing support in the coming months. There are many ways to help. For example: hire the mom or dad for occasional work (the dad is trained as an electrician and is an excellent cook; the mom is willing to do a variety of tasks including older adult care and cleaning services); gather information about local programs (financial support for rent, bus passes, and other basic needs); transportation, and practicing English.
