Why Church? Online Devotions for Lent

During this season of Lent, we explore and ask the question: Why Church? On Sunday mornings we ask as a church, why church? In these online devotions, we ask ourselves, why church? We will reflect on why we go to church and how the church has been a blessing in our life. The church exists for many reasons and throughout different stages of our life, the church helps us, encourages us, supports us and fills us in different ways.

Why Church? Adult Faith Formation Class

Chapel Prayer Stations

Have you had the opportunity to go through the prayer stations in the chapel? If not, do not worry, we are keeping the prayer stations up for all of Lent. We set up the prayer stations for Ash Wednesday and after such positive response, we thought more may like to go through them or people may wish to go through them again. The prayer stations are a self-guided spiritual time of prayer and reflection. Each station has a description that informs you and guides you into the prayer station. You will then begin with reading scripture, which guides you into a response (lighting a candle, reflecting on the cross, seeing yourself as God sees you, confession, writing prayers in sand...) and closing with a prayer. Feel free to come any time the church is open and go through the prayer stations in the chapel.


