Former "Lost Boy of Sudan" Speaks

Arok Garang, a former Lost Boy of Sudan, will speak at St. Philip at 10:15am on June 22 about his Colorado non-profit's successful efforts to educate South Sudanese orphans in Kenya. After fleeing a genocide in Sudan, Arok came to Denver in 2001 from a UN refugee camp on the Kenya-South Sudan border. His talk, "Inspiring Hope - Transforming Lives" describes Arok's journey of survival to Kenya and then the US, where he founded Seeds of South Sudan. Its mission is to educate South Sudanese orphan children in Kenya to become "seeds of change for South Sudan."

Since the founding of Seeds of South Sudan in 2009, **generous sponsors in the US have helped educate 187 orphans.** Now, 82 have graduated high school and 24 are in college in Kenya. Five have earned scholarships to universities in Canada. Arok will speak on the theme of growing ethical leaders.




